

Smiles in a Teardrop

he Great Depression brought chanomic handhips to so many Americans, as banking crises, business fall ands, and widespread unemployment tested the forthfuld of our nation. Despite these challenges, people still sought out leisurely activities. And camping provided an inexpensive way to except Depression era wass.

As things started improving dochomically by the mid-1990s, interest in campers of all sizes took hold. On the diminutive and, the teachop design (so named because of its streamlined shape) explored the imaginations of those who saw the benefit of going small. Don't yourself consubtion plans began to appear in magazines like Outdoor Life. An economical size, simple design, and cosily sourced mate is spopularized the carty tearchop trailers in response, camper manufacturers sprang up across the country, including several in Southern California.

Deciring in 1936, Kaychart Engineering Corporation of Los Angolos designed and built the Kampster model (pictured). Toardrops typcally slept two people and featured an external galley Ktohen. Their light weight mode it a breeze to tow from behind almost any auto.

Tearcrops grow in popularity after World Warill but fellout of (eshion in the 1960s, only to be reclisoxivered in the 1990s. Today, numerous man Ufacturers build an updated version of the little toardrop. Our image captures the moment when leardrop monia began

As you enter, there is a big showroom floor with brand new cars all spit shined and ready for their new owners to pick up. They are given a thorough course on all the bells and whistles of their new ride, then they climb in and drive it right out the door. It is quite a spectacle.

One of the many Vets on display was a 1983, the lone survivor of only 47 of that year made. The other 46 got crushed (not sure why), but this one was found behind some building later, and no one seems to know how it got there. At any rate, it has a home now at the museum. **CONTINUED**


The most impressive thing to me was to hear the story of when, a few years ago, a giant sink hole sucked down millions of dollars worth of priceless Corvettes, on display for a big event, right down thorough the Sky Dome floor. One of them was a 2009, the 1.5 millionth Corvette to come off the line. It was found using metal detectors, buried under rock and dirt with its companions. This and a few others were on display, crushed and mangled.

After an difficult rescue and repair operation, a good size hole was left there for us curious folks to gaze down into. Very deep! The whole salvage operation, including pictures and videos of workers shoring up the walls of the pit and extracting what was left of the cars, was there to view. In addition, our tour guide provided many other facts and stories about this and other displays everywhere.

This was a very worthwhile way to spend the day, and if you ever travel near Bowling Green, we highly recommend checking it out.
