# Smiles in a Teardrop

**T**he Great Depression brought economic hardships to so many Americans, as banking crises, business failures, and widespread unemployment tested the fortitude of our nation. Despite those challenges, people still sought out leisurely activities. And camping provided an inexpensive way to escape Depression-era woes.

As things started improving economically by the mid-1930s, interest in campers of all sizes took hold. On the diminutive end, the teardrop design (so named because of its streamlined shape) captured the imaginations of those who saw the benefit of going small. Do-it-yourself construction plans began to appear in magazines like *Outdoor Life*. An economical size, simple design,

and locally sourced materials popularized the early teardrop trailers. In response, camper manufacturers sprang up across the country, including several in Southern California.

Beginning in 1936, Kaycraft Engineering Corporation of Los Angeles designed and built the Kaymaster model (pictured). Teardrops typically slept two people and featured an external galley kitchen. Their lightweight made it a breeze to tow from behind almost any auto.

Teardrops grew in popularity after World War II but fell out of fashion in the 1960s, only to be rediscovered in the 1990s. Today, numerous manufacturers build an updated version of the little boarder. Our image captures the moment when teardrop mania began.

We found our way to The Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky, the only place in the world where Corvettes are made. Unfortunately the assembly plant was closed because they were getting ready to produce the 2025 models, but the museum was open for business. We booked a tour and got a treasure trove of information about it all.

The place is huge, filled with Corvettes of all years, makes and models, many with stories to go along with them. As you enter, there is a big showroom floor with brand new cars all spit shined and ready for their new owners to pick up. They are given a thorough course on all the bells and whistles of their new ride, then they climb in and drive it right out the door. It is quite a spectacle.

One of the many Vets on display was a 1983, the lone survivor of only 47 of that year made. The other 46 got crushed (not sure why), but this one was found behind some building later, and no one seems to know how it got there. The most impressive thing to me was to hear the story of when, a few years ago, a giant sink hole sucked down millions of dollars worth of priceless Corvettes, on display for a big event, right down through the Sky Dome floor. One of them was a 2009, the 1.5 millionth Corvette to come off the line. It was found using metal detectors, buried under rock and dirt with its companions. This and a few others were on display, crushed and mangled.

After an difficult rescue and repair operation, a good size hole was left there for us curious folks to gaze down into. Very deep! The whole salvage operation, including pictures and videos of workers shoring up the walls of the pit and extracting what was left of the cars, was there to view. In addition, our tour guide provided many other facts and stories about this and other displays everywhere.

This was a very worthwhile way to spend the day, and if you ever travel near Bowling Green, we highly recommend checking it out.
